What is the purpose of this update?

This document tells you how the SBS Wealth High Growth Fund has performed and what fees were charged. The document will help you to compare the fund with other funds. SBS Wealth Limited prepared this update in accordance with the Financial Markets Conduct Act 2013. This information is not audited and may be updated.

Description of this fund

The fund aims to provide investors with capital growth over the long-term, by investing primarily in a broad spread of Australasian and international equities, with a small amount held in cash.

What are the risks of investing?

Risk indicator for the SBS Wealth High Growth Fund:



Example of how this applies to an investor


Hayley had \$10,000 in the fund at the start of the year and did not make any further contributions. At the end of the year, Hayley received a return after fund charges were deducted of \$1,471 (that is 14.71% of her initial \$10,000). This gives Hayley a total return after tax of \$1,377.00 for the year.

Currency hedging

As at 30 September 2025 the fund has an exposure to foreign currency assets of 85.63%, of which 43.29% was hedged back to NZD. This means the fund's foreign currency exposure is 42.34%.
